

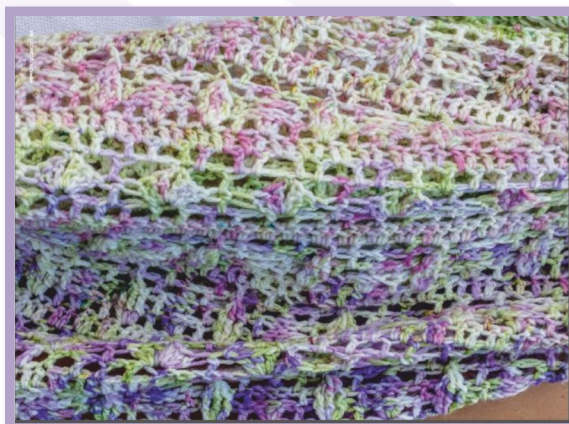

Welcome!!

Introduction:

Imagine wandering through your early morning garden, brushing your hands with the dew drops while the sunbeams touch your face and hair.

You'll keep that feeling alive, your shoulders warm and beautifully adorned, with this stunningly beautiful shawl that you've lovingly created. Sections of "Dew Drops" and sections of "Sunbeams" show off both your skill and the sumptuous yarn.

The supremely talented Sally Ridgway has designed a 4-skein fade called "Garden Bouquet" for creating this shawl. The colours bring to mind flowers that are found in gardens all over Australia: Hydrangea, Pansy, Rose Petal Pink and Hellebore. This is the recommended yarn, but you are welcome to play with other color combinations (as I did for the version pictured below), fiber types and other sizes (a huge shawl or thin scarf are options you can consider).



Some NOTES before we start:

- A. American crochet terms are used throughout
- B. Have fun with this – create using as many or few colors as you like
- C. This wrap takes 20 hours or more to complete – use it as a mindfulness exercise, if you can
- D. This is an adjustable design; width and depth are entirely up to you
- E. Each row includes a start & finish “Self-Edge” to eliminate the need for working down the sides of your wrap at the end. This will mean that you can use self-striping or even manual stripes without the need to worry about an edging color.
- F. The “Edge” is made up of 10 stitches at each end of each row, however the first stitch of the “End Edge” is always the final stitch of the pattern repeat.
- G. **Before you start!!!** Decide the width you require – this one measurement will determine how many stitches you start with, and ultimately, how the shawl will be worn. That said, if you do adjust the width or length of the shawl, yarn requirements will differ.
- H. **Important:** Keep your tails to no more than 10cm, or you may run short of yarn at the end!
- I. Most of my patterns use foundation and chainless stitches – please take this opportunity to learn them; many of my customers are grateful for their new skills!

To make the pictured wrap, you will need....

1200m/1350yd fingering or sock weight (4ply) yarn.

Crochet Hook: 5mm (H)

Yarn needle

Gauge: Approx. 6 rows and 10 dc in 2”(5cm)²

Techniques/abbreviations required...

Foundation Half Double Crochet (fhdc)

Improved Chainless Starting Double Crochet (csdc)

Sun Beam: 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in same st

Front Post Double Crochet (fpdc)

Double Crochet (dc)

Half Double Crochet (hdc)

V-Stitch (V)

Cluster: 3 dc in same st

Linked Double Crochet (ldc)

Chain (ch)

Slip Stitch (slst)

Skip (sk)

(For instructions and video tutorials on any of these techniques/stitches, I recommend Mooglyblog.com).

Working with a Fade:

In order to create a graduating effect with the fade colors, the next color is introduced in a single row towards the end of the previous section. Follow this “Fade Map” to create the same effect for yourself.

“FADE” Map:

C1: Hydrangea, **C2:** Pansy, **C3:** Rose Petal Pink, **C4:** Hellebore

C1: Rows 1-9 of “Dew Drop” section

C2: Row 10

C1: Rows 11-14 of “Sun Beam” section

C2: Row 15 and first 9 rows of “Dew Drop” section

C3: Row 10

C2: Rows 11-14 of “Sun Beam” section

C3: Row 15 and first 9 rows of “Dew Drop” section

C4: Row 10

C3: Rows 11-14 of “Sun Beam” section

C4: Rows 1-15 – both “Dew Drop” & “Sun Beam” sections

C3: Row 1 of “Top Edging”

C2: Row 2 of “Top Edging”



How to make Dew Drops & Sun Beams Wrap:

As mentioned in the Notes, the length and depth of this wrap is entirely up to you. The first row determines the length, so make sure this is correct for you. You'll need a multiple of 8 + 18 stitches to make sure the pattern works.

Row 1. Fhdc 322 (or multiple of 8 (body) + 18 (edging)).
(322 Fhdc)

DEW DROP Section:

NOTE: from Row 2 onwards, there is a "Start Edge" and "End Edge" section on each row.

NOTE: The "Dew Drop" pattern is staggered (using front and back post) to create a reversible fabric.



Row 2. **Start Edge:**
Csdc, (counts as dc here and throughout).
Dc in next st, sk 1.
V (dc, ch 1, dc) in next st.
Sk 2, V in next st, sk 1.
Dc in next 2 sts.
Dew Drop Pattern row 1:
*Sk 1, cluster (3 dc) in next st.
Sk 1, dc*
Repeat from * to * until 9 sts remain (76 times), finishing on a dc (1st st of End Edge).
End Edge:
Dc in next st, sk 1.
V in next st, sk 2,
V in next st, sk 1,
dc in last 2 sts, turn.
(76 clusters, 4 Vs, 83 dc = 76 for pattern and 7 extra)

Row 3. **Start Edge:**
Csdc, dc in next st.
V in next 2 ch-1 sp.
Dc in next 2 dc.
Dew Drop Pattern row 2:
*Fpdc in next 3 dc (cluster),
Dc in dc,
Bpdc in next 3 dc (cluster).
Dc in dc. *
Repeat from * to * until edge (38 times).
End Edge:
Dc in next st.
V in next 2 ch-1 sp.

- Dc in next 2 dcs, turn.
(114 Fpdc, 114 Bpdc, 4 Vs, 83 dc)
- Row 4. **Start Edge:** Csdc, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Dew Drop Pattern row 3:
*Ch 1. Fpdc3tog over next 3 sts.
Ch 1, dc in dc, ch 1.
Bpdc3tog over next 3 sts.
Ch 1, dc in dc*.
Repeat from * to * until edge (38 times), finishing on a dc.
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc, turn.
(38 Fpdc3tog, 38 Bpdc3tog, 152 ch-1, 4 Vs, 83 dc)
- Row 5. **Start Edge:** Csdc, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Dew Drop Pattern row 4:
*Ch 1. Fpdc around next st.
Ch 1. Dc in dc.
Ch 1. Bpdc around next st.
Ch 1. Dc in dc.*
Repeat from * to * until edge (38 times), finishing on a dc.
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc, turn.
(38 bpdc, 38 fpdc, 152 ch-1, 4 Vs, 83 dc)
- Row 6. **Start Edge:** Csdc, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Dew Drop Pattern row 5:
Dc in each st and ch-space along until edge.
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc, turn.
(311 dc, 4 Vs,)
- Row 7. (Start next set of "Dew Drops")
Start Edge: Csdc, dc in next st, sk 1, V in next st, sk 2, V in next st. 2 dc.
Dew Drop Pattern row 6:
*Sk 1. Cluster in next st.
Sk 1. Dc.*
Repeat from * to * until edge (76 times).
End Edge: Dc in next st, sk 1, V in next st, sk 2, V in next st. 2 dc, turn.
(76 clusters, 4 Vs, 83 dc)
- Row 8. **Start Edge:** Csdc, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Dew Drop Pattern row 7:
*Bpdc in next 3 sts (cluster).
Dc in dc.
Fpdc in next 3 sts (cluster).
Dc in dc *
Repeat from * to * until edge (38 times).
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc, turn.
(114 Fpdc, 114 Bpdc, 4 Vs, 83 dc)
- Row 9. **Start Edge:** Csdc, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Dew Drop Pattern row 8:
*Ch 1. Bpdc3tog over next 3 sts.
Ch 1, dc in dc, ch 1.
Fpdc3tog over next 3 sts.
Ch 1, dc in dc.*
Repeat from * to * until edge (38 times).
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc, turn.
(38 Fpdc3tog, 38 Bpdc3tog, 152 ch-1, 4 Vs, 83 dc)

- Row 10. **Start Edge:** Cscd, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Dew Drop Pattern row 9:
 *Ch 1. Bpdc around next st.
 Ch 1, dc in dc, ch 1.
 Fpdc around next st.
 Ch 1, dc in dc*
 Repeat from * to * until edge (38 times).
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc, turn. .
 (38 bpdc, 38 fpdc, 152 ch-1, 4 Vs, 83 dc)
- Row 11. **Start Edge:** Cscd, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Dew Drop Pattern row 10:
 Dc in each st and ch-space along until edge.
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc, turn.
 (311 dc, 4 Vs)

SUN BEAM Section:

- Row 12. **Start Edge:** Cscd, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Sun Beam Pattern row 1:
 * Ch 1, sk 1, dc in next st*,
 Repeat * to * along until edge. (152 times).
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc. Turn.
 (159 dc, 152 ch-1, 4 Vs)
- Row 13. **Start Edge:** Cscd, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Sun Beam Pattern row 2:
 *Sk 1 dc (and associated ch-1 spaces).
 Cluster (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next dc.
 Sk 1 dc (and associated ch-1 spaces).
 Dc in next dc*
 Repeat * to * until edge (38 times).
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc. Turn.
 (38 Clusters, 45 dc, 4 Vs)
- Row 14. **Start Edge:** Cscd, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.
Sun Beam Pattern row 3:
 *Ch 3. Sc in ch-2 sp at center of cluster.
 Ch 3. Dc in next dc*.
 Repeat * to * until edge (38 times).
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc, turn.
 (45 dc, 38 sc, 76 ch-3, 4 Vs)
- Row 15. **Start Edge:** Cscd, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sp, dc in next 2 dc.
Sun Beam Pattern row 4:
 *Ch 1. Dc in ch 3 sp.
 Ch 1. Dc in next sc.
 Ch 1. Dc in ch 3 sp.
 Ch 1. Dc in next dc*.
 Repeat * to * until edge (38 times).
End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc. Turn.
 (159 dc, 152 ch-1, 4 Vs)

Row 16. **Start Edge:** Cscd, dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc.

Sun Beam Pattern row 5:

Dc in each st and ch-space along until edge.

End Edge: Dc in next st, V in next 2 ch-1 sps, dc in next 2 dc. Turn.

(311 dc, 4 Vs)

Repeat Dew Drop and Sun Beam sections 3 more times (or until your shawl is your desired depth), finishing on a Sunbeam Pattern row 4.

Final Rows:

Row 1. Cscd. Ldc in each st and ch-space along until end, turn. (323 Ldc)

Row 2. Cscd. Ldc in each st and ch-space along until end, turn. (323 Ldc)

Finishing:

Step 1. Carefully weave in the ends

Step 2. Dampen your shawl, lay out & gently block into shape to make your stitches “pop”

Step 3. Enjoy!
