## Some NOTES before we start:

- UK crochet terms are used throughout
- The Dreamy Tracks Cowl is a customisable circle scarf that provides many styling options, and can be made to any width or length desired.
- Starting at the top hem, you work in rows, creating a functional button flap in a band. You'll then join your scarf into a circle and work in rounds until you get to the bottom band. This band is also worked in rows, enabling the creation of a second button hole and flap
- Back Loop crochet stitches are used to create the texture. You can choose to work plain/normal single crochet stitches. Your result will be different to mine, yet still effective.

## You will need....

Approx. 220m DK weight yarn – almost any will do!

5.5mm Crochet Hook

2 buttons 1"/2.5cm wide

Yarn needle

(Optional) Stitch marker to mark the start of each round

**Gauge:** Approx 7 sts and 6 rows in htr in 5cm(2")<sup>2</sup>



## UK Techniques/abbreviations required:

|  |  |
|--|--|
| Foundation Half Treble Crochet (fhtr) OR you can do a starting chain and work htr into it. | Back Loop Double Crochet (bldc) – work the double crochet into the back loop only    |
| Double Crochet (dc)  | 3-Treble Crochet Cluster (3-tr cluster) – work 3 treble crochet into the same stitch |
| Treble Crochet (tr)  | Turning Chain (tch) – NOT counted as a stitch  |
| Half Treble Crochet (htr)  | Slip Stitch (slst)   |
| Chain (ch)   |  |

## How to make your Dreamy Tracks Cowl: Top Band:

Working in rows.

(You can adjust the length of your cowl by starting with a multiple of 3 stitches + 8 for the top band.  
Remember to adjust your stitch counts throughout to match.)

- Row 1. Fhtr 149 (OR ch 151, turn. Htr in 3<sup>rd</sup> loop from hook and each st.)  
Turn. (149 htr)
- Row 2. Tch.  
Htr in each st to end. Turn. (149 htr)
- Row 3. Tch.  
Htr 3.  
**Form button hole:** Ch 2, sk 2.  
Htr in each st to end. Turn. (147 htr, 2 ch)
- Row 4. Tch.  
Htr 144.  
2 htr in ch 2 sp.  
Htr 3. Turn. (149 htr)
- Row 5. Tch.  
Htr in each st to end. Turn. (149 htr)

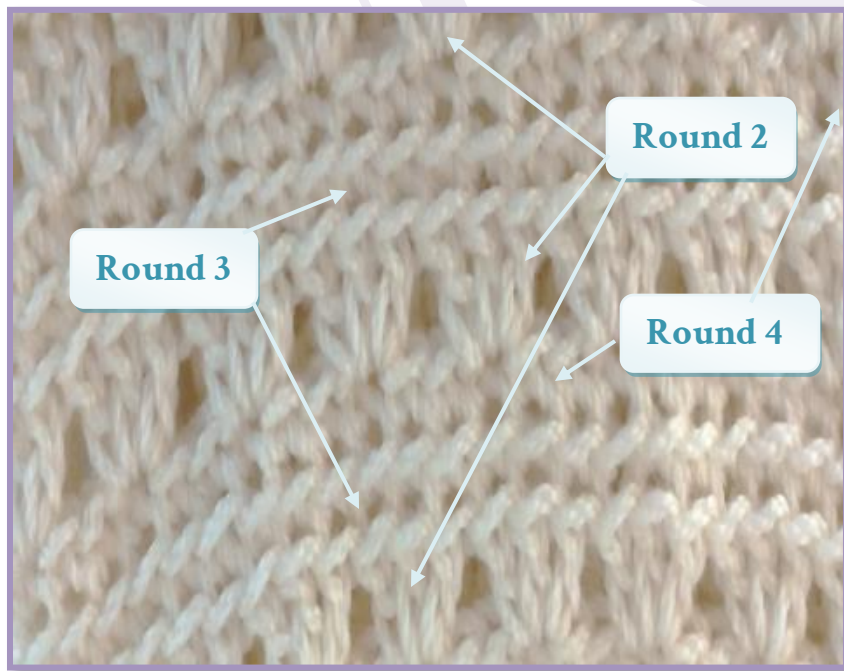


## Center (Pattern) Panel:

### Working in the round.

- Round 1. Tch.  
Dc 141 (or 8 stitches less than your stitch count for the band).  
Join to first dc with a slst. (141 dc. Button tab left unworked.)
- Round 2. Tch. 2 tr in 1st dc.  
\*Sk 2 sts. 3 tr in next st\*\*  
Repeat \* to \*\* until 2 sts remain.  
Sk 2 sts. Tr in 1st st.  
Join to top of 1st tr with slst. (141 tr (47 3-tr clusters))
- Round 3. Tch.  
Bl dc in each st around.  
Join to top of 1st dc with a slst. (141 bl dc)
- Round 4. Tch.  
Bl dc in each st around.  
Join to top of 1st dc with a slst. (141 bl dc)

Repeat rounds 2-4 two more times, or until your cowl is almost as wide as you desire, finishing on a round 2.



## Bottom Band:

Working in rows.

NOTE: Before starting this row, the extra stitches for the button tab need to be worked.

- Row 1. Ch 8. Tch.  
Htr in each ch and st. Turn. (149 htr)
- Row 2. Tch.  
Htr in each st to end. Turn. (149 htr)
- Row 3. Tch.  
Htr 3.  
Form button hole – ch 2, sk 2.  
Htr to end. Turn. (147 htr, 2 ch)
- Row 4. Tch.  
Htr 144.  
2 htr in ch 2 sp.  
Htr 3. Turn. (149 htr)
- Row 5. Tch.  
Htr in each st to end.  
Break yarn and fasten off. (149 htr)



## Finishing:

Step 1. Using your needle, sew your buttons a few stitches from the end of your 2 bands. Fasten off.



Step 2. Sew in all ends.

Step 4. Make some more in other colours and ENJOY! ☺

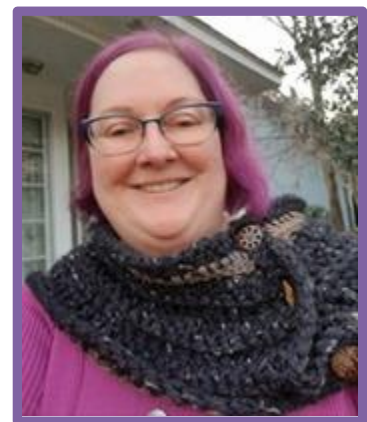

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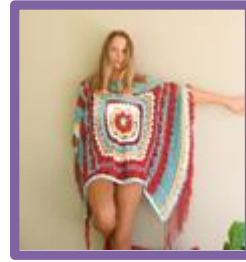
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
